Congratulations on your upcoming wedding and marriage!

Bethlehem Lutheran Church is honored that you are considering having your wedding service here. Some of you are long-term members of the Bethlehem community, while for others this may be your first time here – either way, we are committed to helping all couples being married through the ministry of this congregation to have a joyous and memorable wedding day and a good preparation for a life together. The following wedding policies, procedures and information are offered in that spirit.

Wedding Ministry at Bethlehem is guided by these principles:

- That Marriage is intended to be a life-long commitment and so we will invest time and resources in helping you get ready for marriage. Therefore Bethlehem offers what we believe is a state-of-art preparation ministry. This includes a weekend retreat – *The Engaged Workshop* - and individual time with one of our pastors. (This ministry qualifies for a significant discount on the cost of your marriage license.)
- That your wedding service is an act of *worship of the Triune God*. The bride and groom are honored and their vows are witnessed, but God is the center of attention. Therefore music, prayers and rituals are all carefully planned with the Pastor to reflect your desires while being mindful of the Holy Presence.
- That life together in Marriage is a spiritual discipline. Therefore we will explore with you such issues as finding a church home, prayer in your family life and being of service in God's world.

# Top Five Checklist

- **Scheduling a Wedding Date -** At least 6 months in advance!
  - Please call or email the church office for available dates.

  - Certain weekends during the year are unavailable, these include: New Year's, Palm Sunday, Easter, Synod Assembly, Fourth of July, Confirmation, and all weekends in Advent and Christmas. These are weekends where we are working with reduced staff or multiple special events.
  - Your target date must be at least six months into the future to complete all aspects of our premarital requirements.
  - Receipt of your wedding reservation fee of \$600 ***begins holding*** the date for you and prompts the scheduling of your first meeting with your wedding assistant. If you are a non-member, there is an additional facility fee of \$250.
  
- **Meetings with Wedding Assistant -** Once fee is paid & TBD.
  - You are ***required*** to meet with your Wedding Assistant ***twice*** prior to rehearsal and wedding day.
  - Your first appointment is the review and signing of the BLC Wedding Contract that outlines the requirements for all weddings taking place at BLC. This needs to take place to ***complete*** the reservation process and must happen ***within 30 days*** of receipt of the wedding reservation fee. **If you fail to meet with the wedding assistant during this time frame, your fee will be refunded and your wedding date will be taken off the calendar.**
  - The second appointment will be a check-in on where you are in the planning process. This happens about 4 months in advance of the wedding date. Our wedding assistants will give you guidance on various aspects to your special day that you may not have considered as yet.
  
- **Engaged Workshop -** At least 3 months in advance.
  - This workshop is a ***required*** part of the premarital ministry at BLC. Please call or email the church office to register for your choice of session. Consider doing this requirement sooner rather than later. If you fail to attend a workshop weekend, your wedding may be cancelled at the discretion of the pastoral staff.
  - The workshops are offered three times each year in February, May and October.
  - Attendance is required at one Friday night, all day Saturday workshop. The hours of each workshop are: Friday, 5:30-9:30pm and Saturday, 9:00am – 6:00pm.
  - Meals are provided at the workshop Friday night, Saturday breakfast and lunch.
  
- **Prepare Inventory -** No later than 2 months in advance.
  - The Prepare Inventory is ***required*** as it helps direct the counseling sessions with the pastor assigned to your service.
  - The inventory is available online and can be completed at home. If you do not have internet access we can arrange to have you complete it at BLC. The questionnaire asks questions that have no right or wrong answers but provide your point of view on specific topics.
  
- **Counseling Sessions with Pastor -** After the Prepare Inventory.
  - You are ***required*** to meet with the pastor three times within the last two months before the wedding.
  - You will discuss the reports compiled from your Prepare Inventory answers and discuss music, readings and the specifics of the service.

# FAQ

Q: We aren't members, is that ok?

**A: Bethlehem does not require membership, but does require your full commitment to the premarital requirements and ministry.**

Q: One of us is not Lutheran, is that ok?

**A: Bethlehem joins couples in marriage from a variety of Christian backgrounds and denominations.**

Q: What does my reservation fee pay for?

**A: Bethlehem's reservation fee is an inclusive fee, in that all of the church costs associated with your preparations are included in this fee, including the pastoral honorarium, wedding assistant fee, workshop fees and Prepare Inventory fees. Non-members pay an additional facility fee of \$250. The church's organist is available to serve at your request – she is paid directly and charges \$175 for a wedding and an additional \$25 per rehearsal.**

Q: How many people does the sanctuary hold?

**A: Bethlehem's sanctuary holds approximately 650 people and has 15 rows of pews down the center aisle.**

Q: We would like Holy Communion to be part of our service, can we do that?

**A: Please consider that guests will come from a mixed tradition of sharing Holy Communion. If you decide with the pastor assigned to your wedding to proceed with Holy Communion, Bethlehem will provide wine cups and holding trays, but wine and bread as well as people to set up and clean up are the responsibility of the couple.**

Q: How much can we decorate and when can we do that?

**A: Our policy is that pews may be decorated and fastened with masking tape. You may not fasten anything to the walls. There are several small tables that can be moved to support flower arrangements. Please plan to decorate on Saturday when your reservation starts. We have many groups, church and community, that use our facility, so the security of your items cannot be guaranteed when staff is not in the building.**

Q: Can the flower girl have real flower petals?

**A: No, you may not use real petals as they stain the carpet at the entrance of the sanctuary and aisle. If you choose to go with silk petals, please have someone who is responsible for cleaning them up.**

Q: Can we have an aisle runner?

**A: No, you may not use an aisle runner. Our aisle ends in concrete, which makes fastening it to the floor difficult without ruining the finish and becomes very dangerous for the bride to walk across.**

Q: Can we throw rice or bird seed?

**A: No, rice was a pagan symbol of fertility and birdseed is difficult to clean up.**

Q: Can we have the paraments or decorations changed for our service?

**A: Bethlehem has a dedicated group that rotates the altar cloths and decorations based on the church seasons, whatever is in place must stay in place. You may add to, but not subtract from the décor.**

Q: Can we include our pet during the service?

**A: Pets are not allowed to participate in the service, with the exception of service animals.**

Q: Is the certificate we received at the Engaged Workshop the form I need to get the discount on our marriage license?

**A: No, you do not fulfill the requirements of the discount until you've completed the Engaged Workshop AND your first counseling session with the pastor. You will receive the official Statement of Premarital Education at that time.**

Q: When is the best time to apply for our marriage license?

**A: Marriage licenses are only valid for six months and need to be applied for at least 5 business days in advance. Remember, you'll need your Statement of Premarital Education (eligible only after you have completed the Engaged Workshop and 1 session of premarital counseling with the pastor) to receive the discount – in Stearns County the license goes from \$115 to \$40!**

Q: I can't find the link for the Prepare Inventory, how does that work?

**A: Instructions on how to login and complete the Prepare Inventory are sent directly to your email address after a specific account has been set up for each couple. Typically this happens on or about the first of the month, 2 months before the wedding date. If you need to begin sooner, please contact Linda to set up your account.**

## Wedding Fees

Bethlehem Lutheran Church requires a wedding reservation fee to reserve the wedding date. This fee is due when making the reservation and then is used for costs associated with each item in the policy guidelines. A portion of this fee refundable up to 60 days prior to the wedding date in correlation to where the couple is in the premarital process.

The Infant & Toddler Center is not available for use during wedding services due to liability issues.

# Wedding Policies/Requirements

1. Marriages at Bethlehem Lutheran Church (BLC) are to be the joining together of one man and one woman, two believers, who confess Jesus as Lord.
2. We are committed to serving those who are BLC members or have been regular attendees at BLC for at least six months. All couples requesting BLC to host a wedding for another ELCA congregation must obtain the permission of the pastoral staff.
3. A dating/engaged relationship for a minimum of one year is expected.
4. If divorced, at least one year of legal divorce must pass before consideration for remarriage.
5. Planning and preparation for Christian marriage requires a minimum of six months, unless pastoral permission is given at the beginning of the planning process.
6. All couples are required to work with a wedding assistant. Couples married by a BLC pastor are required to take the Prepare Inventory, attend the Engaged Workshop, and counsel with a pastor. Couples for whom BLC is the host facility, pre-marital counseling is required with the ELCA pastor from your home congregation.
7. For weddings taking place at BLC, wedding services will be held Fridays at 4pm or Saturdays at 3pm. The sanctuary is not available from 4-6pm on Saturdays due to evening worship. Weddings off-site must be approved by the pastor.
8. The wedding service is to be a worship experience. The tone, music, and message in the service must reflect reverence and praise for God as well as celebrate the couple's new beginning. All music must be approved by the officiating pastor. Pets are not allowed to participate in the service, with the exception of service animals.
9. BLC has a strict no alcohol policy on all grounds and in the building. Any members of the wedding party that arrive impaired may be asked to leave at the discretion of the officiating pastor. Guests are also required to adhere to this policy.
10. BLC has a dedicated liturgical environment and altar care team. The decorations and altar fabric hangings (paraments) in place upon your arrival must stay in place.
11. While the coffee kitchen is available for storage and serving purposes, please bring your own supplies rather than using BLC supplies.

As the service indicates, one or more lessons from the Bible help us understand marriage in the context of God's creative love for us. These can be read by the pastor, or by someone of your choosing. Consider some of the following suggestions or consider selecting a favorite Bible story of your own:

# Marriage Vows

If you want to reduce the marriage service to its simplest form, it would be just this: the exchange of promises by the bride and groom. The heart of marriage is a promise. Normally, the vows on page 288 in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal are used.

Other forms you may wish to consider:

I take you \_\_\_\_\_, to be my wife, (husband), and these things I promise you: I shall be faithful to you and honest with you; I will share my life with you; I will forgive you as we have been forgiven; and I will try with you to better understand ourselves, the world, and God; through the best and worst of what is to come until death parts us.

I take you \_\_\_\_\_, to be my wife, (husband), I promise before God and these witnesses to be your faithful husband (wife), to share with you in plenty and want, in joy and in sorrow, in sickness and health, to forgive and strengthen you, and to join with you so that together we may serve God and others as long as we both shall live.

\_\_\_\_\_, I take you to be my wife (husband) from this time onward, to join with you and to share all that is to come, to give and to receive, to speak and to listen, to inspire and to respond, and in all circumstances of our life together to be loyal to you with my whole life and will all my being until death parts us.

If you wish to write your own promises, they should be consistent with the Biblical understanding of marriage, and should make clear that the promises are a lifelong commitment. Since it is the pastor who must certify that a marriage has taken place, he/she will approve the wording before the wedding.

# Musical Selections

Because the pastors are responsible for officiating at the services, it is required that all music will be approved by them. If you can answer "yes" to the following questions, the music is probably appropriate.

1. Does the music text reflect praise and/or thanksgiving to God?
2. Is it based on, or does it reflect, a scriptural theme?
3. Would this song be appropriate for a regular worship service?

**From Interstate 94 West (from Minneapolis)** – Exit at HWY 15 North, turn right on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street South (Holiday Inn corner), turn right on 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue South (Cash Wise corner), stop light, road curves to the right, take a right turn at the stop light (County Road 137), cross over HWY 15 on the overpass, the church is on your left.

**From Interstate 94 East (from cities west of St. Cloud)** – Exit at HWY 23 East, take a right on 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Waite Park (McDonald's corner), take a left on County Road 137 (7<sup>th</sup> Street in Waite Park) at the four-way stop. The church will be on your right just **before** the overpass.

**From US HWY 10** – Exit at HWY 23 West (Division Street), follow Division until you get to 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, turn left on 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue South (Qdoba's corner), cross 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, go past Cash Wise, stop light, road curves to the right, take a right turn at the stop light (County Road 137), cross over HWY 15 on the overpass, the church is on your left.

**From HWY 15 (headed South)** – Turn left at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street South (Holiday Inn corner), turn right on 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue South (Cash Wise corner), stop light, road curves to the right, take a right turn at the stop light (County Road 137), cross over HWY 15 on the overpass, the church is on your left.

**From HWY 15 (headed North)** – When you see the church on your left, continue an additional 1-mile to the first exit, 2<sup>nd</sup> Street South. Turn right on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street South (Holiday Inn corner), turn right on 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue South (Cash Wise corner), stop light, road curves to the right, take a right turn at the stop light (County Road 137), cross over HWY 15 on the overpass, the church is on your left.
